Your calendar should be marked for the 51st Annual Southern California Educational Symposium hosted by the CSNA, Saturday, April 27, in conjunction with the 96th annual National Coin Week, in Carson, CA. The San Diego Inter-Club Numismatic Council, SDCCINC, has once again secured a chartered bus to take attendees to Carson and back. This luxurious air conditioned bus, fully equipped with sanitary facilities, leaves Mission Valley at 7:00 a.m. from the parking lot behind The Broken Yolk Café, 1760 Camino Del Rio North, which is directly across the Interstate 8 from the Scottish Rite Masonic Center, home to the annual Coinarama. Admission to the Symposium is free. A luncheon option is available; please contact Ginny for details and to place your reservation. Two of the four speakers are local numismatic luminaries. Jim Hunt, a member of our club, who will present on the topic of "Private Gold Coinage of the America". Dr. Ken Berger will speak on the topic of "America's Foreign Dollars." The other speakers are Mark Baskin and Ron Shintaku. Mark's topic will be "Civil War Emergency Postal and Fractional Currency - How Counterfeiting and Excessive Costs Led to the Eventual Establishment of the Bureau of Engraving and Printing", and Ron's talk is titled, "1793 Coinage – Historic, Scarce, and Desirable."

Also coming up in just one month, on **May 11**, is our Heartland Coin Club Show. Admission is free to Heartland members as well as the members of other local coin clubs. Veterans and active duty military are also admitted free of charge. For all other guests, the general admission is now \$3.
